Traffic	• In accordance with development approval, access to and from the site for all commercial vehicles, including large deliveries and waste collection is via the Winton-Glenrowan Rd, rather than the Hume Highway directly.
	 Approved traffic changes have been implemented on the Winton-Glenrowan Road. This includes lower speeds for the safe entry and exit of vehicles, and potential short-term road closures.
